Make eye contact with exhibitors! These people are here to help you and answer any questions you may have. Introduce yourself, tell them which high school you're attending and what major you're interested in studying.

Take all information offered to you! You can sort through it later—and your parents may be interested in taking a look as well (especially as it relates to costs and how to pay).

Be open-minded! If you have time, take advantage of being able to ask more questions or explore more schools. There are so many options. Don't limit yourself!

Look for information from the military or community organizations! This may include scholarships, service programs or financial aid. You will eventually have to figure out how to pay—so gather as much information as you can!

2. What are your deadlines for application and for financial aid?
3. How can I arrange a campus visit?
4. How much does your school cost? Do you offer scholarships for students?
5. What type of housing is available and am I guaranteed housing?
