Methacton Boys Tennis:

The boys tennis team has been having an overall solid season with an 11-4 overall record to date. We lost our number one player, Subhanik Purkayastha, halfway through the season due to a stress fracture in his wrist and had to make some adjustments to the lineup. The boys really stepped up and officially clinched the PAC-10 championship last week for the 3rd year in a row with a 9-0 overall record in the league. We have had one of our strongest seasons scoring 7-0 over 7 of the 9 teams in the PAC-10 and only dropping a total of 4 matches.

In individual play, seniors Nick Simeone, Hari Santhanam and sophomore Krishna Suraesh competed in the league singles tournament and Nick finished in 3rd place, which qualified him to compete in the district singles tournament.

Looking ahead we have the league doubles tournament this week and will play in the team district tournament next week.

Methacton Girls Lacrosse:

As the regular season winds to an end the girls lacrosse team finds themselves once again in the Pac 10 playoffs as well as positioned for post season District Play.

The team has offensively been led by Senior Sara Hughes (St. Joseph commit) who scored her 200 career goal on Friday against Perk Valley. Other offensive leaders include Jackie Cerchio (Temple commit) who leads the team in Assists and Daria Lucchesi (JMU Commit).

The defense is anchored by a solid experienced senior core of Katie Markle, Deb Peifer (Manhattan Commit) Julia Cook and Emily Sayre who have been successful in stopping the top goal scorers in the league. The team has had solid wins over non-league leaders of Plymouth Whitemarsh and CB west which has helped them earn a ranking of 17 in Lax power.

Once again the Methacton Girls Lacrosse team will head into the Pac 10 playoffs with the intent to revenge the 1 goal loss last year in the final against OJR.

Methacton Boys Lacrosse:

The boys lacrosse team concluded their regular season with an 8-10 record (8-8 PAC-10). As the fifth seeded team in league they fell one spot short of a Final Four bid. The season saw a number of firsts for the program, including their first ever home night games. The team bested Souderton 10-5 in their first night game then followed by topping league foe Phoenixville 15-5. They dropped a heartbreaker in their final game of the season losing to visiting Harriton 7-6 on a goal in the final 30 seconds of regulation.

Senior Aidan Denecke joined the Century Club during his Senior Season, scoring his 100th Varsity goal this year. He is only the second player in the program's history to achieve that mark. This is even more impressive considering he sat out his sophomore year due to injury. He and six other senior players (Andrew Benci, John Lausch, Gil Price, Eric Dietch, Nick Salerno, and Connor Stevenson) were honored for their contributions to the program during the home night game against Souderton.

The team is finishing their year with a community service project at a local retirement community and look forward to building towards continued success both on and off the field.

The team is led by their ten seniors and the season will be decided over the next week or so. Most importantly, this group has been sensational both on and off the field. Methacton Girls Track and Field:

The Girl's Track and Field team has been having a season full of exceptional performances. Multiple team members are amongst the top performers in the District and the State. And multiple team members have broken records. Our school's 4x100m record was broken by the relay team of Caroline Duffy, Lauren Prusacki, Amy Domenick, and Rainah Dunham with a new time of 48.61 seconds. The Triple Jump relay of Rainah Dunham and Fallon Brown broke the Oxen Reider Meet Record jumping 70'8.25" combined. At the freshman/sophomore Falcon Invitational, Fallon Brown created a new Pole Vault record of 10'3" and Lauren Prusacki created a new record in the 100m dash running 12.3 seconds.

We are now entering into the PAC Championships with a 7-2 winning season and as one of the top competitors with an equal chance of winning the title. The girls are a strong force. Their unity, perseverance, talent, and drive has led them to their current success and will continue to take them to new heights as they enter into the Championships.

Methacton Boys Track and Field:

The boys Track & Field team is now 8-0 with one league meet remaining against Spring Ford next week. Entering into the last week of the regular season with the championship to follow the boys are locked in for the final four and will compete for the overall Pac 10 Championship being held at Phoenixville May 13th and 14th.
