- 1. Sign in and Welcome Introductions: Gabby welcomed everyone.
- 2. Old Business: Gabby reported Paper Recycling was bought by another company, we can still put paper in it but we are waiting on communication to see if we will still make money.
- 3. President's Report: Gabby Winters

Coordinating council "kick off" meeting was Monday and was well attended including Gabby Winters and Dr. Reddish. We have a tax ID #, liability insurance. The treasurer's meeting is Thursday. Gabby Winters will also be auditing all Home and School's books. The Coordinating Council will continue to meet monthly.

5. Recording Secretary's Report: Michelle Petko

6. Treasurer's Report: Liz Drummond

Liz opened with we have achieved enough cash to cover remaining expenses. We raised \$6527.00 from the Walk-A-Thon and \$2000.00 from Kidstuff books. We will be currently paying the holiday craft night expenses, the upcoming Veteran's Day expenses, and directory printing expenses. We also paid Coordinating Council dues and Art Goes To School expenses.

We reviewed our mini grant applications as follows:

- 1. Mrs. Kennedy submitted \$387.39 for a bookshelf.
- 2. Mrs. Brower submitted \$461.90 for a new reading rug.
- 3. Third grade team \$444.30 non-fiction theme books.

We voted to approve the third grade team non-fiction books along with splitting the cost of Mrs. Brower's rug with the school which Dr. Reddish had approved as well. Mrs. Kennedy's bookshelf application will be deferred for now and reviewed next quarter.

7. Corresponding Secretary's Report: Susan Washburn

Susan reported that she will send a thank you note to Mr. Hopf for his presentation on Veteran's Day as well as Panera Bread for their donations of food and coffee.

8. Principal's Report: Zanthia Reddish

Dr. Reddish opened with a thank you for the Veteran's Day assembly and Fall Fest.

She also discussed our SPP score of 78 which is on the lower end. Dr. Reddish and the teachers are working on ideas to "grow" the students. Common Core instruction is emphasized. Dr. Reddish is also working with other elementary schools in Methacton as they share ideas during their building visits. Some ideas discussed:

1. Increasing Kindergarten # of words.

2. "Wow" not every day words, words on assessment. Starting in Nov. they will have a drawing for students who get the words correct.

3. Core standard materials, the test is different. Covers 3 weeks, Math, Science and Reading. PSSAs can also be taken on the computer now, but as a district we have elected not to do this at this time.

4. There will be no teamtime on Wednesdays, teachers will be reviewing areas that need improvement. They will be working with students in asking them to do more explanation of their thinking.

5. ERA (Early Rising Achievers)

6. *New* Reading and ISS will be working with 3rd and 4th grade students on foresight testing. They will "challenge" students....every student is a tree and that student ("tree")

can see how they grow and will receive tickets for the growth which can be used for prizes.

7. Utilizing Study Island which they can do on the internet café.

8. We need more emphasis on Math. Skyview is piloting a new Math program and we may need to investigate new math options and new math curriculum.

9. Educator effectiveness for teachers. SLO (student learning objectives)

Lastly Dr. Reddish discussed there are discussions of a transportation/technology committee. First Student mentioned if we would like to utilize the scanning of students as they get on and off the bus which was not welcomed by the majority of the attendees at the H&S meeting.

9. Teacher's Report:

Ms. Ehmer had the students put their thumbprints on the buddy bench with Home and School volunteers. Mrs. Fusco will have group and individual activities and advise students the bench is for kids that may be feeling sad, may not know what or who to play with at recess. If other children see a child sitting there, they could go over and ask their buddy if they are ok.

She is also going to begin the Career Fair in the upcoming months and will be inviting guests to speak to the children. Mrs. Ehmer noted she will have an intern that will also be helping organize this.

10. School Board:

Brenda Hackett reported on the field light project. Bids are open for the lights and we are waiting on Worcester Township approval. She had noted there is a safety issue with no lights so they are all hoping for continued progress. December the Board will elect new officers and reorganize. One of the policies up for discussion is "class size" trends. It also should be noted there are 2 new classes for MHS. Robotics and 9th grade seminar study skills.
