It's been quite a year in Second Grade... we have witnessed young second grade children gradually transform into third graders.

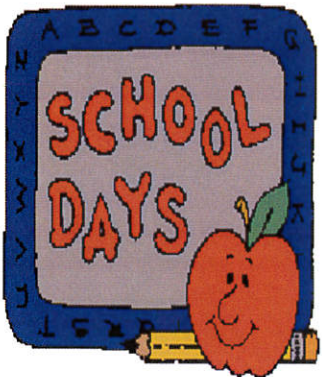
Loved sharing with each other and making lasting memories of a wonderful school year.
