We will completing Chapter 5: Shapes and Patterns in Math in Focus. The next chapter focuses on counting, comparing and ordering numbers to 20.

First grade will be making gingerbread houses on Friday, December 15<sup>th</sup> from 9:15a.m. to 10:45a.m. Many parent volunteers are needed for this activity. We are looking forward to a fun filled month.

#### Welcome, December!

As we near the end of 2017, our second graders are involved with many interesting topics for study and practice.

Unit 4 in Math In Focus concentrates on Using Bar Models with Addition and Subtraction. Children will use mental arithmetic in class and at home. Solving number stories with several strategies are being practiced as well. The Math class scenarios will include adding on, taking away, and comparing sets to compute. Then, it's on to Multiplication and Division in Chapter 5!

We continue working in Wonders into our third book in the ELA program. The children read to find the Author's Purpose and to differentiate selections between fiction and non-fiction. We will be continuing comprehension and finding details by rereading.

Be ready to hop aboard the Polar Express with your passport as we visit many countries to discover their celebrations of Holidays Around the World! Each week, the children will discover many new facts about the world and participate in activities that tie together holiday lessons. All aboard!

<u>ELA</u>- In ELA we are on our second unit and are continuing to work on our grammar and writing skills. Our main grammar skill this marking period is nouns: common and proper, singular and plural, and possessive nouns.

The children are also busy learning how to incorporate new writing crafts into their pieces.

<u>Math</u>- In math we have completed Chapter 6. This chapter focused on multiplication and division, and understanding the different properties of X. Please continue to practice multiplication facts with your

child each night. It is important to memorize their facts. Our next chapter will focus on area and perimeter.

<u>Social Studies/Science</u> - We have started our SS and Science switches and the children are enjoying their new teacher. Our focuses are natural resources - air, water, and land, and for SS - migration and traditions. Be sure to ask your child which part they are learning! Wishing everyone a safe and happy holiday filled with family and friends!


#### Music
