First Grade News

First Grade will celebrate the 100th day of school in February!

We will complete Unit 3 in the Wonders Program in which we explored how things changed over time. Then first grade will begin Unit 4: Animals Everywhere that delves into what animals are like and what we know about them. Continue to make sure first grade students practice the High Frequency Words nightly to improve reading fluency.

In math, we will be finishing Chapter 8: Addition and Subtraction to 20. This chapter is devoted to learning how to add and subtract doubt digit numbers with and without regrouping. After Chapter 8 the first grade students will take the mid-year Math in Focus assessment to see how they are retaining the math skills learned so far in first grade.

February marks the 100th day of school. First grade will celebrate the 100th day of school! In addition, we will be learning about Groundhog's day, Valentine's Day, President's Day and Famous African Americans.

Our Second Graders are in the third unit in our ELA program! Here, students will be practicing and applying skills in comprehension which are identifying plot and sequencing. The grammar lessons will include all types of verbs.

As we begin taking a deeper look metric measurement in Unit 7, the second graders will learn more about the thinking and proving processes of the Math In Focus program. Please continue to use the MSD website for fact practice.

Also, February brings the Social Studies unit-Famous Americans. Each child will prepare and present a project on a Famous American to share with all second grades and Woodland. Following that, the students will learn about forces and Simple Machines.

Third Grade News

Third Grade Thrives!!

Third grade continues to work hard everyday!

<u>ELA</u>- In ELA we are working on unit 3 - with a grammar focus of subject and verb agreement and verbs. The children enjoyed learning about idioms and discussing what they thought the idiom meant vs. the real meaning. The children are always busy writing: adding new writing crafts into their pieces, and we are continuing to work on our close reading and are focusing on taking annotations as we read, and answering complex questions using evidence from the stories.

<u>Math</u>- In math we are focusing on division in chapter 8 and have started long division. Please continue to practice multiplication and division facts with your child each night. <u>Social Studies/Science</u> - Classes are all at a different spot in Science or SS as we work hard to complete each topic. Focuses now are on: traditions and holidays, migration, air and and land and water as a natural resource.

We look forward to seeing some of you at conference time. As always, thanks for working with your child and for your continued support!

Fourth Grade News

The winter is definitely upon us. We are finishing Unit 6 (Fractions) and will soon be into Chapter 7. It is important to keep up with basic fact practice. A little bit of practice can go a long way.

Look for a switch in your child's science teacher! We will be changing teachers for the Science Curriculum in early February.

Make sure that your child is keeping organized with their portfolio. It is so helpful to them to be on top of their assignments.
