
Kindergarten News

We are adding our last words to our word wall this month! **Who good come does** are the new words. In science we will study the life cycle of a butterfly and the life cycle of plants. What an exciting month!

First Grade News



First graders are doing a fantastic job reading with the Clifford Reading Incentive Program. When completed they will have read over 2360 books. Students will celebrate their accomplishment with a party and weeklong celebration of reading.

First grade is continuing to work in the Wonders Unit 5: Figure it out! In this theme students are learning different spelling patterns including r-controlled vowels and vowel pairs. Students have been practicing alphabetizing, cause and effect, prefixes and abbreviations. Students should continue to practice all high frequency words from the entire school year.

In math, students will be working with numbers to 120. They will also be adding and subtracting numbers to 100. Students should continue to practice addition and subtraction focus facts.

Second Grade News

Hello MAY!

With the beautiful and much-needed warmer weather here, we start in on this last quarter of Second Grade studies. Our second graders are learning all about animals this month. We will take a look at adaptations, food chains, and life cycles before our trip to the Philadelphia Zoo on the 17th. They are incorporating lots of new vocabulary into their studies.

In ELA, students continue to work to strengthen their reading and writing skills. Unit 5, titled Let's Make a Difference, provides children with opportunities to learn about various topics such as Our Heroes and Rights and Rules. We will continue with the integrated studies of spelling skills, pronouns, summarizing, make/confirm/revise predictions, and learning multiple-meaning words.

Math brings us into more multiplication tables, graphs and line plots, and shapes and patterns. Math In Focus challenges our students to think about and share solutions to in the real world. They have learned how to add and subtract and apply those skills over and over again, and use bar models to show their thinking!

So many fun and exciting experiences are still to come before school ends... Summer is almost here!

Third Grade News

Third Grade Thrives!!

The end of the year is coming fast......

<u>ELA</u>- Third grade is working on our fifth unit in ELA. This unit includes skills on point of view, summarizing, and cause and effect, and homophones. Third graders all picked a biography to read and research, about a famous person, and are designing a biography poster. We are so proud of all their hard work, especially on their PSSA testing!

<u>Math</u>- In math we completed our unit on geometry. This chapter focused on geometry terms with angles and shapes, and learning how to find the area and perimeter of a shape. Please continue to practice basic multiplication facts at home. It is extremely important not only because we are starting double digit multiplication, but because fourth grade comes quickly and students are expected to know their basic facts.

<u>Science/SS</u> - We are working on our final unit of science - Natural Resources - either air, water, or land, and communities in SS. Please review the vocabulary with your students on a nightly basis.

Look for more information to come home about field day, fun day, and our field trips!

Fourth grade has completed the PSSA testing throughout the month of April. The students have done a great job. The students worked very hard and we are very proud of them. We feel that the students were well prepared for the testing. Congratulations fourth grade!
